Crisis Management:

Can a business enhance reputation through adversity?

The next Institute of Directors Guernsey Winter Seminar has been announced, taking place on Friday 27 January, titled 'Crisis Management at the Top'. The seminar will be held at 12.15pm at the Digital Greenhouse.
